



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Is there an application fee?

Yes. There is a \$20.00 non-refundable application fee.

Do I need to submit a photo with my application?

Yes. Please attach a current headshot of yourself (5X7, COLOR, NON-RETURNABLE) with your name printed clearly on the front.

Can I pre-register online?

Yes. Pre-registration is available online. You may complete your application packet ahead of time. Please bring your completed application packet with you to auditions.

Can I register on the day of the auditions?

Yes. Applications will be available at the registration/check-in area. Walk-ups will be accepted at the door.

Can my friends and family watch the auditions?

No. The auditions are closed to the public.

What can I expect during the dance audition?

When it is time to audition in front of the judges, you will be asked to perform the routine taught during the dance auditions in groups of 2-3. Please prepare at least six 8-counts of your own material to be performed individually to a generic dance song. The routine should showcase special talents and/or dance styles you enjoy. You will not be judged on choreography.

What should I wear to the dance auditions?

Please wear form-fitting dance or athletic attire and gym shoes (non-marking soles) or dance shoes. Hair and makeup should be glamorous, professional, and performance ready. A sports bra/half top, hot shorts, and flesh colored nylons/hosiery is suggested. No capris or long pants allowed.

What can I expect during the interview?

You will sign up for an interview with the directors as soon as the dance auditions are completed. Time slots will be available on a first come-first serve basis and the interview will last 20-25 minutes. During this time, you will be asked to introduce yourself and answer questions regarding the Enforcers organization, the Enforcer Girls, current events and/or general questions about being a member of a team.

What should I wear to the interview?

Please dress professionally. Business attire is recommended. Hair and make-up should be done as though you were attending a special event.

If selected to be on the Enforcer Girls, will I be paid?

No. The Enforcer Girls are semi-professional dancers, but the position is unpaid. The Enforcer Girls volunteer with the San Diego Enforcers to support charity. The team appears at local, corporate, and charity events around San Diego.

Will I have to purchase my own uniform?

No, you will not have to purchase your own uniform. The Enforcer Girls uniform is provided for the duration of the season. You will be responsible for the uniform and must be kept clean at all times. You must pay for any items lost or damaged. All uniforms and property (excluding team apparel) must be turned in at the end of the season (date TBD). You will be required to purchase your own boots as they will not be returned to the Enforcer Girls at the end of the season.

What time commitment is expected if I am selected to be a member of the Enforcer Girls?

Attendance is of the utmost importance as teammate. Total commitment is required by all team members. Commitment includes, but not limited to:

Rehearsals

Mini-Camp (One 2-day team mini-camp in January 2018)

Photo Shoots (Dates TBD): Including but not limited to: Bikini calendar photo shoot, Team photo shoot, Enforcers photo shoot

Appearances and Events

Evening rehearsals during the work week (starting as early as the 2nd week of October)

Enforcers home games until the end of the NPSFL season (includes Championships)

Does the team travel with the Enforcers for away games?

Travel is optional; however, highly suggested.
